Mechanisms of Igneous Intrusion

“Almost 50 year ago, the LGS and the University of Liverpool hosted a Symposium entitled ‘Mechanism of Igneous Intrusion’, with over 200 attendees and attracting the lead researchers in the field from around the world. Proceedings from the symposium were published in a book with the same name, focusing on magma intrusive processes from their initiation, ascent and emplacement. The now famous ‘orange book’ still has its place on the bookshelves of eminent researchers across Geosciences, and

contains what have now become the foundations of today's models of magma intrusion. In this talk I will review the advances in igneous intrusion models that have been made over the past 50 years, and describe some new exciting developments in the field."
