# Tuesday 19th January

Lecture by Dr James Lea, University of Liverpool: 'Now you see them, now you don't: Greenland's vanishing meltwater lakes'

James Lea will talk about recent advances in mapping and understanding the behaviour of the thousands of meltwater lakes that form on the Greenland Ice Sheet every summer, identifying instances of their rapid drainage through fractured ice and what this means for the ice sheet.
