Thomas Clifford, Principal Geotechnical Engineer and Maisie Mansfield, Geotechnical Engineer, Atkins meeting at 7.30pm

in Lecture Theatre 137 of Liverpool John Moores University,

This evening lecture will look at the importance of geological modelling to help manage ground related risk whilst looking at the capability of new technologies to offer more insight into ground characterisation. Through several project examples ranging from a dam foundation to quarry excavations, highway cuttings to a reservoir wall, Tom will show how traditional methods, established and emerging technologies were used to understand the geological problem or communicate ground risk to stakeholders.

The final case study presented by Maisie Mansfield, considers the role of remote sensing mapping, utilising multiple sources of data including hyperspectral aerial imagery to provide a better understanding of ground conditions between intrusive ground investigation locations, to inform design and reduce geological risk.
