Brymbo Fossil Forest Open Day



Brymbo Heritage Trust is conserving, restoring, and celebrating Brymbo's rich natural, industrial, and social history. The Trust's Heritage Site at Brymbo, North Wales is the location of the Brymbo fossil forest – a 300-million-year-old fossil forest.
