Tuesday 17th February 2026, Tuesday 3rd March 2026.

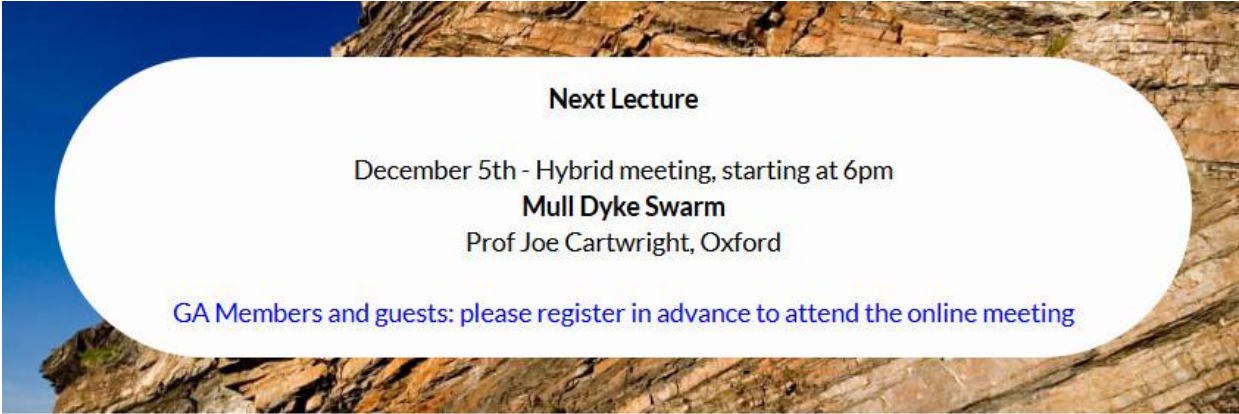
